All Saints Day: A Timeless Tradition of Faith

Dear Friends in Faith,

As November unfolds, we find ourselves at the cusp of a special day in the Christian calendar - All Saints Day. While the rest of the world may have bonfires and fireworks on November 5th, for those who hold dear the teachings of John Wesley and the tradition of Methodism, All Saints Day on November 1st carries a profound significance.

It reminds us of the enduring connection we share with Christians who have preceded us and those who will follow. It's a day to honor the saints, both known and unknown, who have enriched our lives and deepened our understanding of God's grace.
