Dear Beloved Bethel Family,

December has arrived, and with it comes that holy mixture of wonder, reflection, and anticipation that only the Christmas season can bring. The sanctuary feels a little warmer, the world seems a little softer, and our hearts bend more naturally toward hope. As we prepare once again to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ—the Light who shines in the darkness and is never overcome—we also find ourselves at the close of another year of ministry together.

Over these past months, our sermon series has invited us to examine what faithful living looks like in a world often complicated, noisy, and unruly. From Paul's encouragement to the Thessalonians, to the Gospel's reminders of perseverance, community, and the call to live purposefully, we have been learning together what it means to stand firm in Christ. We have explored themes of steadfastness, grace, responsibility, and spiritual vision. And like the early church, we've been reminded that faith is not idle—faith moves, serves, hopes, and reaches.

The Incarnation is the ultimate example of God stepping into our story—into our work, our struggles, our fear, and our longing—with compassion and purpose. And it is this same spirit that calls us forward as a congregation.

Though we have faced challenges this year—financial ones, cultural ones, and the ongoing challenge of strengthening a community with many generations—we have also seen God at work in powerful ways. Our growing heart for outreach continues to shape our identity. Whether it's the ministries shared through our Family Life Center, our partnerships beyond our walls, our emerging small groups, or new gatherings forming around discipleship, we are continually being drawn back to the same truth: the church doesn't exist for itself. We are here to reflect Christ's love into the world.

I am especially grateful for the ways new ministries are taking root. One of those is "Momco", which continues to create connection and community for mothers seeking encouragement and support. This ministry embodies what we've been preaching—faith that moves, faith that lifts others, faith that makes room at the table. Their presence is a gift not only to those who attend but also to the life of Bethel as a whole.

As Christmas approaches, I invite us to carry forward the spirit of our recent sermon series into the coming year. Let's persist in doing good. Let's pursue Christ-centered community. Let's share our faith with courage and tenderness. Let's look for the places where God is already stirring hearts and join in. Let's be a church where strangers become family, where grace is practiced, and where the light of Jesus Christ burns bright in every season. (con't.)

May the peace of Christ rule in your hearts this Advent. May the joy of His coming renew your strength. And may the hope of His presence guide us as we step boldly into a new year of ministry, mission, and love.
