Who do people say the Son of Man is?

You are Christ, the liberating King. You are the Son of the living God. (Matthew 16:13-16) The "Christ" title is not Jesus' last name. It is a declaration that He is the King, a king who came to free us and to liberate us from the bondage of sin and death. In doing so, He is making all things right in this world, restoring the Garden He created.

Jesus:

"Simon, Son of Jonah, your knowledge is a mark of blessing, for you didn't learn this truth from your friends or from teachers or from sages you've met on the way. You learned it from my Father in heaven. This is why I have called you Peter (Rock): for on this Rock I will build my church."

I have been fascinated with how many "Peter's" I have met. I have met several people whose actual name is Peter. I am not referring to these people, but rather to people who have been a solid rock where God's Kingdom is built. I am referring to the influential people in our lives who have demonstrated what it means to be a disciple and share God's love with the world. I'm sure as you are reading this, some people are popping into your thoughts. Have they shaped you so that you are a role model for someone else?

I am sharing these thoughts with you because we are celebrating the Sundays of Easter; until May 23, the day of Pentecost. We have spent all of Lent preparing, cleansing, and repenting so that we can be pure at the time of the Resurrection of Jesus. Now in the Easter season, we are blessed with the opportunity to proclaim Jesus the Son of the Living, Risen God. The living God, who offers salvation to all the world without cost. It is our job, just as it was Peter's, to make Jesus known. It is not through the prophecy that it is warning us what is to come. It is not John who goes through the visual motion of purification. Unless you change your heart, your inner being, no amount of water will wash away your sins.

Can you fathom the idea that Jesus died for your sins, specifically yours! We don't just turn on the television or

Maundy Thursday


