Exploring Worship through the Life of David

Dear Friends,

As we journey through the summer, we invite you to join us in an exploration of worship through the life of David, focusing on 2 Samuel chapters 5, 6, 7, and 11. David's story offers us profound insights into the nature of worship and its place in our lives. For David, worship was not confined to specific times or rituals; it was the very essence of his being. His life, with all its triumphs and failures, was a continuous offering to God.

Worship in Victory: 2 Samuel 5

In 2 Samuel 5, we see David's ascent to kingship over Israel. After years of waiting, David is anointed king, and he captures Jerusalem, making it the political and spiritual center of Israel. David's initial actions as king highlight his heart for worship. He sought to establish a place where God's presence would dwell among His people. For David, leadership and worship were inseparable. He led with the understanding that his authority was under God's ultimate rule, acknowledging God's hand in his victories and reign.

Worship in Celebration: 2 Samuel 6

Chapter 6 gives us a vivid picture of David's exuberant worship as he brings the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem. David danced before the Lord with all his might, demonstrating a passionate and unreserved worship that came from deep within. This chapter challenges us to consider our own expressions of worship. Are we willing to worship God with abandon, without concern for others' opinions, as David did? His wife Michal's disdain for his display serves as a reminder that true worship may sometimes invite misunderstanding or criticism, but it remains a heartfelt offering to God.

Worship in Covenant: 2 Samuel 7

In 2 Samuel 7, David desires to build a house for God, but instead, God promises to establish David's house forever. This covenant is a pivotal moment, reflecting the reciprocal nature of worship and relationship with God. David's response is one of profound humility and gratitude, recognizing the incredible honor and grace bestowed upon him and his lineage. This chapter invites us to reflect on how we respond to God's promises and blessings. Do we, like David, approach God with a heart of humility and thankfulness, recognizing that all we have comes from Him?

Worship in Failure: 2 Samuel 11

Finally, 2 Samuel 11 presents a stark contrast, showing David's failure in his sin with Bathsheba. Despite his close relationship with God, David was not immune to temptation and sin. However, this chapter also underscores the importance of repentance and seeking God's forgiveness. Worship includes recognizing our failures and returning to God with a contrite heart. David's life reminds us that worship is not about perfection but about continually turning back to God, even when we stray.

Conclusion

Through these chapters, we see that worship was indeed the core of David's life. He worshiped in times of victory and celebration, in moments of covenant and promise, and even in his failures. David's example teaches us that worship is more than an act; it is a lifestyle, a constant orientation towards God in all circumstances. As we delve into these passages this month, let us be inspired to make worship the heartbeat of our lives, offering ourselves fully to God, with all our joys, struggles, and imperfections.

The children received prayer buddies figures with scriptures daily along with crafts and science projects and some expended energy in the recreation station. Upon arrival they were given name lanyards and draw string backpacks. Then on Friday they each received a t-shirt, a certificate of attendance, and a drink bottle.

Saturday was the **Spaghetti Dinner** with about 66 in attendance. We all moved to the Sanctuary to watch the children sing and quote scripture.

Then Sunday we all worshiped God with praises and led by the NBCF Praise Band with upbeat music and enjoyed a Potluck Lunch together. There were 99 in attendance. Many that we hosted commented what a welcoming church we are.
