## **Leadership Board Updates:**

Aug. 20th updates:

**Spiritual Formation**- A devotion about how hospitality is the heart of Christianity.

**Trustee:** Tim Smith is preparing to paint the outdoor trim of the church this year. The air conditioner in the FLC will cost approximately \$52,000 to replace. The parts have been ordered and we hope to have a repair date soon.

Repairs to the alarm system will be \$3,340 are almost finished.

The Board voted to proceed with repairing the furnace as soon as it can be done.

This is an old building and many replacements on heat and air units will be in the future. Currently \$26,000 was removed from The UM Foundation for the deposit on the FLC air/heat unit.

We are looking at options for signs and/or speed bumps in the driveway.

Smithsburg Class of 2011.

She was the county volleyball player of the year each of her 2 final seasons as the Leopards went 38-0 over that time and winning state championships each season. She averaged 6.10 kills and 1.46 blocks per set as a junior; and 6.92 kills (a county record for rally scoring) and 1.58 blocks per set as a senior. She was also a two-time all-county first-team basketball player. She played college volleyball at American University and UAB.





Granddaughter of Cathy Grantham...

Gabby Grantham-Medley North Hagerstown Class of 2023 Gabby was named #1 in the Herald Mail recently published "Top 30 Washington County girls athletes of the last 25 years". She was a two-time Herald-Mail volleyball player of the year — and that wasn't even her best sport. That would be basketball, where she was a three-time all-county first-team honoree before signing to play at Duquesne. On the volleball court, she led the Hubs to a 37-2 record and the 2022 Class 3A state championship her final two seasons; averaging 4.09 kills and 2.92 digs per set. Over her final two basketball seasons she averaged 21.2 points, 9.0 rebounds, 3.4 steals, 3.3 assists and 2.3 blocks.
