"Everyone at the Table: The Depth of Our Shared Humanity"

There's something deeply human about sitting around a table. Meals are more than food; they are a symbol of belonging, relationship, and community. But the truth is, far too often we decide—consciously or not—who gets to be at the table and who doesn't. Who gets a full seat, and who we ask to sit quietly at the edge.

In our fractured world, it can be easy to surround ourselves with people who look like us, think like us, vote like us, or live like us. We might claim diversity because there are different skin tones in the room, but true inclusion goes deeper than color or culture. It asks: Are we giving everyone an equal place at the table? Are we recognizing the full, messy, beautiful humanity in each person, even those who make us uncomfortable?

Jesus did. Jesus saw people. Really saw them.

He didn't just welcome the rich and powerful (though He dined with them, too). He shared the table with tax collectors, sinners, prostitutes, and zealots. He touched the lepers. He spoke with women others ignored. He crossed social, religious, and cultural lines—not to make a point, but to make people whole. And He did it without asking them to pretend to be anything other than who they were.

In Luke 14, Jesus told a parable about a great banquet. When the invited guests made excuses, the master of the house told his servant: "Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind, and the lame." "Sir," the servant said, "what you ordered has been done, but there is still room."

Then the master told his servant, "Go out to the roads and country lanes and compel them to come in, so that my house will be full." (Luke 14:21–23) There's always more room at God's table. But here's the challenge: we don't all need to sit at the head. Some of us will be called to lead, to teach, or to speak boldly. Others will serve quietly, offer wisdom, or create space for others to thrive. Our value doesn't depend on our visibility. When we understand this, we can stop scrambling for the best seat and start honoring the presence of others around us. We learn to listen, not just speak. We learn to share, not dominate. We begin to experience the depth of humanity as God sees it: diverse, complex, beloved.

So let's build tables, not pedestals. Let's welcome stories that are not our own. Let's invite the ones who've been left out or pushed to the margins—not out of pity, but because we need them to be whole. Let's follow Jesus' example, who didn't ask whether people belonged—He showed them they did. May we be the kind of community that reflects that grace. Where everyone has a seat. Where no one has to fight to be seen.

Where we don't just say all are welcome"—we actually make it true.
